Congratulations to Claudia Camp and David Gunn, recipients of the MHA November award for Yard of the Month.

After the drought and heat of the summer, this yard is bounding back with a variety of blooming flowers and plants. Outlined in river stones, the parking area between the street and sidewalk is covered with flashy orange cosmos, green potato vine, purple heart and Indian blanket flower with a Chinese pistache tree adding texture, fall color, and shade.

According to Claudia, their yard has been a project that has evolved through trial and error. They've been keeping it all organic and have been trying to choose mainly perennial plants that can manage the heat and have something blooming during each season. David has terraced the sloping portion of the front yard with natural gray stone edging and river stone (Mexican beach pebbles). This area has been a work in progress with plantings of flowers such as variegated irises, alyssum montana, pink zinnias, purple lantana, purple pincushion (scabiosa), Chinese fringe flower (lo-rope-tulum), black foot daisies, and more of the bright orange cosmos, with more to come.

Aggregate stone steps leading up to the center sidewalk are flanked by large pots at the top of the steps containing tropical hibiscus, purple nurembergia, and red verbena. Containers in various shades of blue holding white dianthus and Swiss chard line the top of the porch wall. Pink knock-out roses, purple potato vine,



pink periwinkles, Texas Gold lantana, horehound and lavender add a variety of textures and colors to cover the flower bed in front of the porch. By the time this newsletter is distributed, large pink chrysanthemums should be blooming by the west side of the driveway.

Thanks go to Claudia and David for their continuing efforts to beautify their yard. For these efforts, they will be rewarded with a generous gift certificate provided by Calloway's Nursery.



GARDENING

Winter

If you love pansies: Try the Plenifall & Rain trailing series of pansies.

These pansies are fantastic for cascading out of containers and trailing across the ground. They have solid cold performance just like any other pansy or viola. Full sun. 6-8" tall x 18-24" spread. Be sure to plant your pansies with 3 in. of organic mulch. This keeps soil temperatures even and prevents the freezing and thawing that heaves them out of the ground.

If you dig bulbs: Get the Chinese Sacred Lily, white with an Orange Cup, Large cupped multi-flora blooms 10" to 12" works in all southern soils, half shade to full sun, blooms early Jan to early Feb, grows on natural rainfall, spreads by offsets, strong citrus scent.

If you like ornamental cabbage: Osaka red cabbages look like beautiful burgundy-silver roses all winter long. These beautiful cabbages give the garden a floral aspect in the dead of winter.

Go online to keep track of accelerated road and bridge projects

Interested in knowing the status of road and bridge projects in your neighborhood? An updated list of arterial and neighborhood street projects is now online: www.fortworthtexas.gov/tpw/projects/

The Transportation and Public Works Department has projected spending levels in six-month intervals for the next 18 months. This action is in response to the City Council's call for a revved-up program to complete more street projects in Fort Worth.

After Council members voiced frustration at the length of time it sometimes takes to start and finish

a road project, the department implemented a plan to speed up the delivery of road improvement projects. The goal is to have the backlog of neighborhood street projects under way within 18 months, using unspent bond funds.

Although there is a limit to how fast roads can be built without sacrificing quality standards, the city is committed to completing projects and starting new ones as quickly as possible.
