How to Obtain a Garage Sale Permit

Garage sale permits can be obtained online at fortworthtexas.gov or by calling 817-392-2222 or by applying in-person by visiting the Development Department Permit Desk, 1000 Throckmorton, Fort Worth, Texas.

Why is a Garage Sale Permit Needed?

Code Compliance Department, 817-871-6320, regulates garage sales. Garage sales are permitted within the city limits of Fort Worth under the following rules:

- There are not more than two sales, in number, on the same premises in any one calendar year.
- The sales are held by a person who does not hold himself out as engaging in, or does not habitually engage in, the business of selling such property at retail
- The sale shall be confined to the garage, patio and/or yard of the premises.
- The duration of each such sale shall not exceed three (3) consecutive calendar days.

April's Yard of the Month recipients are Scott and Susan Harwell of 2208 Weatherbee Street. The Harwells have lived in Mistletoe Heights for almost 20 years and have been street reps for almost as many. Susan stated that their their most recent yard efforts have been in their backyard, such as a beautiful arbor and a pond where they spend most their time. In the front yard, they will be planting summer annuals and deep red and white caladiums in their pots on the front porch.


The most recognizable aspect of their yard is on the front street corner- a tall stand of yaupon holly, trimmed into a mushroom shape, surrounded by five smaller rounded yaupons. This includes a bed of irises, pink and white peonies and chrysanthemums. Purple cone flowers, salvia and ivy are in the bed on the opposite side of the front yard.

The Harwell's hope their struggling flowering crabapple will recover from last summer's heat and drought. The far west side of the yard is lined with Indian hawthorns with a taller privet hedge behind it as a border dividing their yard from the neighbor's yard.

Pink tea roses, dusty miller and Nellie Stevens hollies divide the front yard from the back yard. The flowering shrubs and plants are budding and should be in full bloom in April.

A weeping yaupon tree anchors the corner of the expansive front porch. Purple oxalis, pink and purple larkspur, red poppies and more Indian hawthorne shrubs fill the beds in front of the porch. Little Gem magnolias, Japanese yews, liriope, Mexican petunias, Texas clematis vines and pyracanthas are on the east side of the fence on the Jerome St. side.

Thanks to the Harwells for providing a well maintained attractive yard. For their efforts, they will receive a Calloway's gift certificate.



The minutes from the February 21, 2012 minutes were approved.

Treasurer's report was given. Total income was \$877.24. Total Expenses were \$1,704.96. Net Income was \$827.72 Balance in the neighborhood account is \$18, 727.00


Old Business: Next Tuesday at 6 p.m., there will be a meeting at St. Stephen's Presbyterian church to discuss the proposed train station.


Thursday, March 22, there will be a meeting with Kenneth Bahr and Joel Burns to discuss the sound barrier. The five homeowners that have a vote concerning the sound barrier will attend the meeting which will be held at the home of Rosaline Takes.

New Business: Norm Stemple spoke about gas drilling/ leasing. He gave a history of the previous negotiations

The meeting was called to order conducted by the neighborhood gas committee with XTO. XTO has drilled a well, but has not begun to pump gas from the well. The lease continues for those homeowners who previously signed a gas lease with XTO. XTO is offering homeowners, who have not previously signed a gas lease, a \$4,000/acre signing bonus with 25% royalty. Norm Stemple can provide the contact information for those wishing to contact XTO.

> Feral cats: Rose Lynn Scott Spoke concerning the trap, neuter, release program for feral cats. Previously the neighborhood has trapped and sterilized approximately 100 cats. Rose Lynn has 4 humane traps that can be borrowed if you wish to trap and spay/neuter feral cats near your home. The Humane Society offers sterilization for \$15.00 on certain days of the month. Zoning: The triangle is zoned 2-family. Gaye Reed commented that the triangle is currently classified by the city as a park and therefore will not be developed.

The 2200 block of Rosedale is currently zoned e-commercial. It was recommended that the best way to change this to 2-family was through a council iniatiated zoning change.

Neighborhood Beautification

■ Sidewalk tree planting

Additional trees have been planted on the berm. Mike Danella would like to landscape the entrance at Jerome. The city of Fort Worth will provide free trees that can be planted between the sidewalk and the street. The homeowner has to agree to water the tree for at least one year. Mike Danella will send out an interest form that homeowners can complete if they would like one of these trees. Kathleen Walker would like her fellow

neighbors to consider trees other than Live Oaks. Live Oaks are large trees that need more space than is available in an urban yard. The city of fort worth has a list of trees approved and forbidden for planting in the parkway.

■ Entrance Sign

A picture of a proposed new sign for the neighborhood entrance was distributed (at right). Cost estimates range from \$15,000-19,000.

Website: The

neighborhood currently uses
Mailman as our internet service provider.
The problem is that this provider limits us
to 250 emails per hour. Currently we have
approximately 260 people on the email list.
Mailman did up our limit to 275 emails per
hour. The email moderator, Scott Ewing,
recommends that we move to another
internet service provider that does not limit
the number of emails. He also makes the
recommendation that we change the name
of our neighborhood website to Mistletoe
Heights.org because .com is associated
with for-profit organizations. The change
in internet service provider would require





Tree planting initiative for neighborhood

One of the unique characteristics of our neighborhood is the abundance of mature trees along many of our streets. As stated on the city web site "In addition to increasing property values by up to 20%, studies have shown that trees can reduce crime rates, slow the speed of traffic on residential streets, dampen noise, reduce stress and promote a feeling of wellness."

The city has a Neighborhood Tree Planting Program and we have a lack of trees along some of our streets. Here's an opportunity to fill those empty spots with new trees - and the trees are free to participants.

The available trees have all been approved by the city for placement within the street right-of-way. If you want to plant a tree not on the list, the cost and labor would be your responsibility.

This is a voluntary city program to plant trees and help beautify neighborhoods. We are responsible for digging the hole and planting the trees. Digging and planting labor may be available if you are unable to do it yourself. The trees will come in 5-gallon containers. Regular tree watering is the most important follow-up. According to the city Forestry Section, "By planting approved species, utilizing proper planting techniques, and by watering slowly and deeply rather than lightly, frequent application, the likelihood of sidewalk

damage is greatly diminished."

Here are a few basics of the program:

- ■Someone must act as a neighborhood coordinator-that would be me, Mike Danella.
- ■Trees must be planted between the sidewalk and curb, not within the resident's vard.
- ■A group of 25 to 75 residences (addresses) must commit to plant and water the trees in the parkway.

For now, up to 75 residences can sign up. The neighborhood must plant the trees (or find volunteers to plant them).

Several species of trees will be available. Rank your preferred tree(s) on the attached sign-up sheet. There is no guarantee you will receive your preferred tree.

A waiting list is in effect, so first-come, firstserved. A week or two prior to delivery, the Forestry Section will survey the neighborhood and mark optimal planting locations within the parkway (according to spacing and visibility requirements).

If you are interested, I can get you a form, either by email or regular mail. Once completed, I will coordinate with the city. I would like to get at least 25 addresses to begin the process and soon as possible.
