world-class art museums, a thriving downtown, affordable housing, easy access to an international airport, and a public education system they can trust to prepare their children for college or career readiness. Fort Worth is uniquely positioned to offer many of these essential elements that attract companies of various sizes. So, how can you help lure the next Toyota or Amazon HQ2? By the simple act of volunteering at a public school.

We are blessed with a wonderful public elementary school in Lily B Clayton. Both of my children have attended Lily B and my wife is a kindergarten teacher there. I feel comfortable in saying that my children are getting a great education in the Fort Worth ISD. However, there are many schools in our city that are struggling. According to the latest TEA Accountability Ratings, 42% of FWISD schools received either an "A" or "B" grade, while 58% of received a grade of "C" or below. Even

though FWISD led most large urban districts in accountability gains, there is still much work to do.

You are reading this article as 2018 draws to a close and we look forward to 2019. I would ask you to consider volunteering one or two hours per week at a local public school as part of your routine for the coming year. As a member of an organization called Leadership ISD, I spend several hours a month at various public schools all over Fort Worth. It has been such a joy to see community members investing in students who desperately need someone to read to them or simply listen and encourage them. 

Get to Know a Neighbor, Jim Peipert

Its not every day that you walk into one of your neighbor's home and find a photograph of Nikita Sergeyevich Khrushchev,



First Secretary of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, hanging in his study. But then again, not every neighbor is Jim Peipert, the last Western journalist to photograph Krushchev in public.

If you've read any of the newsletters over the past few years, you've likely seen many of Jim's photographs that he takes for us (free of charge!). Before he was a

professional newsletter photographer, Jim had quite the career and life. After graduating from Southern Illinois University, he married Mary Ellen in San Antonio. Then he embarked on an international career as a journalist for the Associated Press. His journalism took him to Chicago, New York, Moscow, London, Johannesburg, and Narobi, Kenya, from 1968 until 1987.

My personal favorite photograph of Jim, is one that he didn't take. It features him, while covering the 1968 Democratic National Convention in Chicago, having a friendly interaction with the local police. (See below.)




Jim and family, by then including three boys, moved to Fort Worth in the late 1980s. Once in Fort Worth, Jim became the national and foreign editor for the Fort Worth Star-Telegram

and later was on its editorial board. He retired from the Star-Telegram in 2008 and continued to pursue his favorite hobbies, bicycling and photography. Even after retiring he didn't slow down. That same year he rode his bicycle from San Diego to St. Augustine.

If you find yourself at a future neighborhood event, I recommend you take the time to get to talk to Jim and find out more about his crazy career.

Presidents Report

Update on Triangle Park Irrigation: Decision has been made to bore under the road, actual time to begin is pending. Primary goal: provide water to the triangle.

Berm discussion: after the drip system was fixed, the water bill from the city did not change. If anyone notices any water leaks, please notify one of the officers.

•A resident brought up the area at the corner of Rosedale and Mistletoe Drive that is unruly with weeds and could we get a group of volunteers to help clean it up? Suggestion: organize a neighborhood wide clean up to address this area of concern.

New Security Committee: Email was sent asking people to participate in a security committee. The president of Berkeley Heights approached our association asking if

we would like to join them in purchasing cameras that catch license plates in hopes to counteract crime. The cost goes down with increased camera install/purchase. Question is, does it payoff, i.e., cost of cameras vs cost of petty crime.

Treasurer's Report

Jeri Jo Blackmon, Treasurer, discussed income/expenses, and dues donations. Sum: Income: \$12,574.00, expenses: \$8,404.11. Dues Donations stat: 10-year history of dues collected; in 2009 \$5346 with 141 people donating. In 2018 \$9929 with 143 people donating. Average people donated: 121. Average yearly donation: \$6652. Of the 500 homes in our neighborhood, only 143 people donate.

Officer Elections

Susan Presley was in charge of the nominating committee this year. As all current officers were agreeable to maintain their current positions with the MH Association, a motion was made that the officers remain in their current positions. Motion approved.

Old Business

Sidewalk update: they are in progress now. Walking path to Pappadeauxs update: On hold as an ATT cable is buried very shallow and will have to be moved before the path can continue to be built.

New Business

Suggestion: add a checker table and hopscotch to the Triangle. This was followed by a brief discussion about this idea.

October 2018 Yards of the Month

Welcome to Fall, gardeners! Ok, the temperature's been up a bit the past couple days, but somehow you can just feel the change in the air. Garden colors are sharper as the sun gets lower, and it's the time of year when reliable re-bloomers like Knock-out roses and long season annuals get over their summer lethargy and start popping with new blooms.

That's just what's happening in the front garden of our October Yard of the Month, the home of Beth Wild and Carlo Galotto at 2235 Mistletoe Blvd. Beth, a sales rep for art supplies, has lived in this house for many years, but we can now also welcome Carlo, her husband of just a couple years. Carlo hails from Italy and until recently was the proprietor of Chimera restaurant on Magnolia.

The most striking feature of Beth and Carlo's yard, as seen from the street, didn't even exist until a couple years ago when Beth, tired of having to use the driveway to get up the hill from the street, had a lovely set of sandstone steps installed in the bank of welltended St Augustine grass that rises from street level. The steps are bordered by planting beds along each side and culminate in a circular stone patio at the top, though this is less visible from street level. Smaller circles of sandstone then lead between two multi-branched yaupons to the steps of the front porch. The yaupons are old enough to be the size of small trees (Beth figures about 40 years!) and are each circled by wide, sandstoneedged beds.



Beth has used only a small variety of plants in the step-side beds, which enhances

emerging in the spring.

The street-level view of the yard is also enhanced by the wide bed that curves up alongside the full length of the driveway. Several white crepe myrtle bushes thrive in the middle of the bed, with carpets of red-orange lantanas that have just sprung into bloom stretching above and below.

Those with occasion to mount the steps (why not go introduce yourself to Beth and Carlo if you don't already know them!) will find more blooming bounty in the large circular beds around the yaupons. Red, white, and pink begonias provide

> most of the color, complemented by dark green holly ferns, graygreen lavender, and a touch of blue plumbago. The beds just in front of the porch wall include a dense mix of crepe myrtle, roses, and well-trimmed holly, eleagnus, and yaupon. Around the side are daylilies, amaryllis, climbing roses, and a peony.

Though the near-to-house plantings aren't visible from the street, Beth's new steps and hillside beds provide eye-catching statements for a good part of the year. Thanks, Beth and Carlo, for your beautifully planned and maintained yard!
