While it is always a crazy, busy time of year, your officers and our generous volunteers continued to work to move things forward for Mistletoe Heights. All of our fabulous holiday events were a roaring success. One of the

most exciting future items is mentioned at the end of this article. Don't miss it!

When I took the role of President, I set some high-level functional items and goals to get in place for the MHA. One of which was better tracking of all of our association's working items. I implemented a web-based SmartSheet for visibility that is shared across your MHA leadership and city staff. My goal with this project list is not only to define accountability, but also provide an easy hand-off when support is needed or leadership changes occur in the future. In the last month we have been working on several items. Brian Hunt and I met with our council representative, Elizabeth Beck,

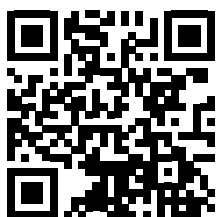
and her staff to go over some of our working items. Our goal was to ensure an open line of communication for future neighborhood needs. We got a water leak on Mistletoe Boulevard fixed and road patched. We are working with the city to clean up the West Rosedale berm and CTP underpass just north of Mistletoe on Forest Park. While the city does not repair existing sidewalks, we should soon have a list of city-approved contractors for sidewalk repair with a goal of organizing better pricing per foot by offering the contractors a larger bulk of work.

I have coordinated speakers for our next two MHA meetings, with the first being Chad Edwards, EVP of Strategy with Trinity Metro. He will be at our next meeting to give a status update on the TEXRail Medical Station. Elizabeth Beck will be the guest speaker at our following meeting to give an update on city efforts and take feedback/questions from us. And for the BIG news ... we will be having our future MHA meetings in the private upstairs space at Wine Haus. The goal is to allow for more residents to attend by having a larger space and allowing for a social aspect at the end of the meetings to build neighborhood relationships. I am excited for 2024 and everything that the MHA and YOU will be able to contribute towards keeping Mistletoe Heights in its position as the best neighborhood in our great city.

Dinners with Tom ...

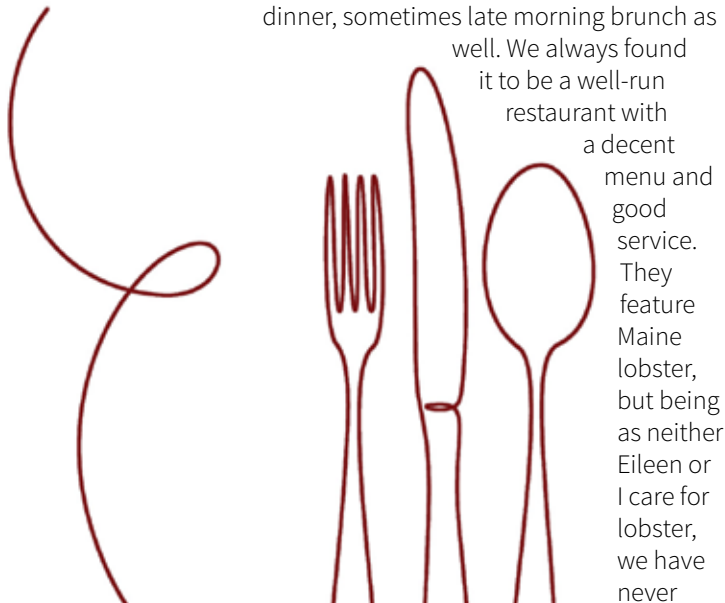


Tom Richey shares tips and information about restaurants in and around our neighborhood.

In 1928, the same year my house was built, Steve Murrin Sr., a well known rancher, built a business based structure on a triangle of land that he owned adjacent to Camp Bowie Boulevard. It opened as a restaurant known as Steve's Triangle Place and successfully operated until the early 1940's. It then became known as Renfro's Triangle Café. For a short while, from 1947 until 1950, it reverted to Steve's Triangle Good Food. In 1950, it became Duncan's Cafeteria and was then bought by the Findlay Group in 1951. It remained as Findlay's Cafeteria until one of the first Black Eyed Pea restaurants took it over in 1979. Then, in 1993, it was reincarnated as its current establishment, Lucile's Stateside Bistro. It is notable that upon approaching the doors, that there is still an inset in the sidewalk that says "Steve's".



We used to occasionally stop into the Black Eyed Pea at that location and soon after it became Lucile's, we would regularly enjoy lunch or dinner, sometimes late morning brunch as well. We always found it to be a well-run restaurant with a decent menu and good service.



They feature Maine lobster, but being as neither Eileen or I care for lobster, we have never

tried it. **They also are known for chicken fried steak which is excellent, several times voted Best in Fort Worth,** as well as a variety of seafood, steaks, sandwiches, and pizzas. I can say, I have never had a meal there that I did not enjoy! Full bar is also available but if you happen to opt for the large Margarita, it does come with a shaker that pours about three glasses — tasty, but it can be dangerous. The desserts are good — the Key Lime Pie is my favorite.

If you haven't been there, give it a try. It's worth the experience!
