A: Design complete. Hopefully construction will start by the end of the year. Which means we will be riding trains in 2028. As construction starts, we will have more regular meetings to explain what's happening.

Q: The grant ... was through IIJA grant. If it's not good, do you have recourse to get back?

A: A lot more confident we will get those dollars ... it's through USDOT.

Q: How do pedestrians get there?

A: Will have improved crossing at Mistletoe Blvd. and will have sidewalks that go across the tracks as well. Have moved insertion to Lesly Ct. with 4-way traffic light.

Tom Richey shares tips and information about restaurants in and around our neighborhood.


I used to travel a lot for business, actually for a number of years, I spent about 75% of my working time in one far-off town or another. One of the downsides of being in an unfamiliar town is knowing where decent meals might be had. I have never cared very much for chain restaurants, I generally find them bland and monotonous. However, they do have a positive side in that they are usually consistent and you know what to expect. So, I generally found myself going to a chain of some sort my first night in a different town, just for the consistency. After spending time in town and at the workplace, it was possible to find a few spots more to my liking.

That consistency still holds true here, as sometimes it's nice to go to a place where you know what to expect and maybe, just maybe, happens to be pleasing. One such place that we have enjoyed for several years is **Charleston's** on Hulen Street. Chain? Yes. Consistent? Yes. Menu? Pretty good, actually. When we are in the mood for a casual meal that is relatively inexpensive in a comfortable setting, we head to Charleston's. The interior is pleasant in a clubby sort of way, the bar is good, the menu is short but contains some well-done dishes. The dinner salad is very good actually (and this coming from the guy who dislikes "green foods") — lettuce, some radish, croutons, tomato, egg — and is served with a very tasty croissant that is drizzled with honey. The champagne

vinaigrette dressing is excellent. I often opt for the meatloaf made with ground beef, sausage, and mixed cheese, topped with a tomato brown sauce — I find it different from any other meatloaf that I have encountered and quite tasty! One of my other favorites is the Hawaiian Ribeye, marinated in a pineapple/soy/ginger sauce. The menu includes starters, burgers, and sandwiches (the Reuben is good), chicken dishes, and specialties with several fish selections. Plus, a listing of side dishes — the burgundy mushrooms are very good. Not to mention a decent selection of desserts (key lime pie!).

It does get busy sometimes but I have never experienced a ridiculously long wait. Monday through Friday, there is a "Social Hour" with reduced prices on drinks and starters — the bar area is very comfortable as well. They also offer a gluten free menu. It is located in Trinity Commons, close to the Tom Thumb market. We like it for casual dining, chain or not, Tom's thumb is up!
