Drew Medford Memorial Tournament

10 Years, \$189K+ in Scholarships Awarded, and Newly Formed Youth Board Celebrates with \$10 for 10 Campaign

What began as a tribute to Drew Medford has grown from 12 to 28 teams, becoming one of DFW's largest high school baseball tournaments — awarding \$189K+ in scholarships and now empowering student leaders through the \$10 for 10 campaign. As a nonprofit organization, the tournament creates opportunities beyond baseball, inspiring young athletes to grow as leaders and community contributors.

This tournament isn't just about baseball; it's about opportunities. That realization motivated Drew's niece, Grayson Grant, a Paschal senior and Berkeley Place resident, to take her involvement further. Volunteering since she was nine, she saw the chance to carry the mission forward by creating the DMMT Youth Impact Leadership Council (YILC).

The council, pictured, was formed with ten founding members, all Paschal seniors, each holding a specific role on the board—from fundraising and marketing to communications and outreach—ensuring every member has a hands-on leadership experience. On the board is also Kate Bearden, a Mistletoe Heights resident who, along with her good friend Gray, has been volunteering for DMMT since they were little. Their first initiative—\$10 for 10 Years—aims to inspire 1,000 people to give \$10 in honor of the tournament's 10th anniversary, providing scholarships and giving students hands-on experience in nonprofit leadership, fundraising, and community impact.

The heartbeat of the tournament is Drew Medford himself — a Paschal High School graduate, Mistletoe Heights resident, and TCU freshman who was set to pitch for TCU before his life was tragically cut short in 2016. Drew was known not only for his talent on the field but also for his humility, drive, leadership, and compassion. These values became the foundation of the tournament created in his honor, ensuring that his legacy continues to inspire future generations.

What started with 12 teams has now grown to 28, including a few from outside Texas, making it one of the largest high school baseball tournaments in DFW. Unlike other tournaments, DMMT is unique in that each team nominates one player to receive a college scholarship — awarded to someone who embodies Drew's values as a leader and a player. To date, more than \$189,000 in scholarships have been awarded.

Each year begins with the Annual Kickoff Dinner, which has grown to host more than 500 high school baseball players at the Paschal High School Gus Bates Gym. Attendees hear from a guest speaker who shares lessons on character, perseverance, and leadership. Past speakers have included New York Yankees legend Dr. Bobby Brown and Texas Rangers GM Tom Grieve.

Beyond the field and the scholarships, the tournament has become a movement—an opportunity for young athletes to be part of something bigger than themselves. It's a space where leadership, character, and teamwork are recognized and celebrated, and where Drew's spirit of humility, compassion, and drive is passed on year after year. Players are honored not solely for being the best athlete on their team, but for exemplifying the values that made Drew a remarkable teammate and person.

Now, with the launch of the YILC, students are stepping into leadership roles themselves, learning firsthand how a nonprofit organization operates and how to mobilize their peers for good. Their debut initiative, the \$10 for 10 Years campaign, embodies the heart of the tournament: small acts of generosity multiplied by many can create lasting impact.

Dinners with Tom ...



Tom Richey shares tips and information about restaurants in and around our neighborhood.

As I may have mentioned in past writings, we have a tradition that when my wife, Eileen, is out of town, my son and daughter who live in Fort Worth, take me to dinner. What that essentially means is that they pick the venue, I get to pay.


Several weeks ago Eileen flew to Cleveland along with her sister, to visit their brother. A prime opportunity for the familial dinner extravaganza. My children chose Bocca Osteria Romana in the South Main area. As everyone knows, Italian is fine with me so off we went. Parking was a bit of an issue as with all of the South Main venues that we have tried, but we found a street spot a block or so away and made our way to the alley (called the Squeeze) where the restaurant resides. Entered to a closed in patio that looks like it would be quite pleasant in the fall. We had reservations so we had virtually no wait for a table. The place was very busy and moderately loud as I find most of the newer places to be.

We started with cocktails and appetizers of Focaccia and Polpette Al Sugo (meatballs) which were excellent. They only feature Italian wines so sommelier son chose a beautiful bottle of Negroamaro. Daughter ordered Pappardelle al Ragu, son ordered the Lasagna al Forno, and I opted for the Saltimbocca. This was the first time I have found Saltimbocca in Fort Worth. It is chicken breast layered with prosciutto and sage in a white wine sauce. In the northern

climes, it was always veal with the prosciutto, so I was a little concerned about how that would be utilizing the chicken. My fears were allayed with the first bite, it was delicious, I almost ate it all. Son and daughter could not finish theirs either as the quantity was so great, both were very impressed with the meal. We finished with a very nice Tiramisu. We all brought home enough for lunch the next day.

Other items on the menu include home made pasta, cacio e pepe, lamb chops, osso buco, and risotto. All in all, an excellent selection and all very well done, combined with excellent service — it is well worth the visit.

Meeting was called to order by Brian Hunt.

Forest Park Blvd: NPO was called, 18-wheeler trucks from TCU should no longer be using FPB. FPB has been restriped and the redlight poles at the intersection of FPB and Mistletoe Boulevard have been repainted.

Treasurer's Report: Dues donations are down for 2025 by\$9000+. Please considered making a donation this year if you have not already done so.

A Book account at 1st Financial Bank was set up several years ago for collecting book sales and book donations. It will soon be closed and added to the PNC account. Right now, the money collected for the neighborhood book is a little greater than the expenses of the book, but it was recently discovered MHA will have to pay State and local Sales Tax.

Newsletter Report: Elisa is waiting for this meeting before finishing the newsletter. Expect to receive it soon.

Water: Taking longer than the neighborhood expected. Besides the expected inconvenience and noise, no major concerns had been reported. Once the water and sewer mains are done, the streets (with major water work) will be repaved. The repaving will probably not be finished before Christmas.

Email guidelines: Updated email guidelines will soon be posted to www.MistletoeHeights.org.

NPO: FWPD Police Beats Are Changing — Fort Worth Police Joshua Campbell, the temporary Neighborhood Police Officer, attended the meeting. If there is anything going on in the neighborhood that needs to be reported, call 911. If it can wait a day or so, you can call Officer Campbell or email him. The permanent NPO will start in October. Beginning August 9, some Fort Worth Police beat boundaries changed. Residents and businesses can find their NPO's name and phone number by visiting the city's online data portal OneAddress.

Some of the issues brought up were:

- The homeless guy sitting on center median at FP and Rosedale Call 911
- National Night Out is October 7th. (MHA and Berkley will meet at Lilly B. Food trucks and other entertainment for the kids will be planned.)

New Code Enforcement Officer: Matthew Hayes prefers emails if you need his attention, but the MyFW app is the best method of reporting for fastest results.

New Historic Preservation Officer: Lorelei Willet has a presentation she will send to the officers, which will be forwarded once it's received. If you are not in the overlay and are expecting to do some major work, you may be eligible for a Historic Site Rehabilitation permit which enables a city tax freeze for 10 years and a city tax exemption of 20% afterwards. The work must be performed within two years of the granting of the permit.

If you are in the overlay and are planning any work or new build, you need to apply for a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) through the HISTORIC AND CULTURAL LANDMARKS COMMISSION. There is an increase in the number of COA's and you need to engage with the MH Historic Committee. If you are new to the neighborhood and don't know you're in the overlay, a new water account will give you that information

Graham Brizendine said he would like the neighborhood to revisit the topic of the overlay boundaries with a hope to include all of Mistletoe Heights.

Squatters: If you know of any, contact Code Enforcement immediately.

Zoning Change: Cameron Mitchell's family owns the Building on the Northeast corner of Mistletoe Boulevard and Jerome that houses Nag Law, a spa and Pilates Works. They also own the vacant lot between the Pilates Studio and the railroad tracks. The lot is zoned I (light industrial) but is planning to have the lot rezoned. The Mitchells are planning to build eight 3-story townhomes on that lot. Cameron emphasized they will be nice homes, not with cheap siding that you may see in the TCU area.

Volunteers: We need a judge for the Halloween Pumpkins (contact Brian Hunt). Judging will be October 30. Tuyen Kamo, tuyen.kamo@att.net, will again send out a map of houses giving out candy. If you would like to be included, contact Tuyen.

We also need a "Yard of the Month" volunteer.

Christmas: Christmas on the triangle will be December 6th and the Christmas Potluck will be December 7th, hosted by Grace Mitchell on Mistletoe Drive.

Books: The website for book sales has been suspended until a Texas Sales Permit has been received. There was some discussion as to how MHA is organized, as whether we are a non-profit or a for-profit organization. Jeri Jo Blackmon stated we had never applied for non-profit status and she had never filed an IRS tax return. No one seems to know where the original organizational paper work is. If you know, contact the Officers at officers@mistletoeheights.org.

Adjournment: Motion was made by Rosaline Eastepp Takes to adjourn at 8:05 PM and was seconded by Corey Bearden.
