





MINUTES

Social Hour of the Mistletoe Heights Quarterly meeting at 6:30pm with a presentation of a signed card and cake to Jeri Jo Blackmon. Jeri Jo is not only retiring from her day job but also as MHA treasurer, an office she has held for 17+ years. Jeri Jo, our good friend, "Thank you for your service and I hope you enjoy your retirement and I hope to see you more often around the neighborhood."

The business meeting was called to order by Brian Hunt at 7:00PM.

Minutes from the last quarterly meeting had been emailed to the neighborhood. No corrections to the minutes were submitted. A motion by Patrick Sheridan was made to accept the minutes into record, seconded by Randy Burkett. The motion passed.

Graham Brizendine presented an update on the Forest Park Blvd closing and traffic issues due the filming of the Taylor Sheridan TV series *Lioness*. Graham met with Mia Boatner (District Director I), Brian Rey (Lioness Location Manager). The Parking passes were discussed and it was suggested to have just one pass that lasted the entire season. It was also noted the production team is wanting to be good neighbors and Brian Rey has moved into The Towers on Park Place. It was noted *Lioness* has donated \$5000 to Lili B Clayton

auction and \$5000 to Paschal. Filming for this season has been completed, but there may be a day of reshoots.

Councilman Beck's office sent Graham with a link for the 2026 fiscal year budget and the tax rates. Expect that email to be forwarded from Graham. Ms. Beck wanted everyone to know the Mobile Toolshed program has expanded to the entire city. If you need tools to maintain yard or trees, you may want to borrow tools from the Mobile Toolshed. 2026 Council meeting schedule has been finalized.

The World Cup is coming to town. This is expected to be a bigger deal with visitors and traffic than the NFL Super Bowl. Currently, AirBnB's are not allowed in the neighborhood. 200,000 people are expected in and around the stadium during games. Tickets went on sale this week.

OFFICERS' REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report: See attached documents. Donations are down this year. If you have not donated to MHA, please consider making a donation before the end of the year. The donations help pay for Christmas Pole decorations, Christmas Party at the Triangle, 4th of July Parade, and neighborhood movie nights. See attachment for donation form.

Secretary's Report: If you are not on email list, please consider joining. You can find a link at www.MistletoeHeights.org The officers receive many emails from the city and the secretary will forward them via email if they are pertinent to our neighborhood.

Newsletter: Elisa's team is working on the next issue and wants input by the middle of December. Please send photos from neighborhood events. If you have ideas for the newsletter or would like to see a neighbor featured, send Elisa an email. Send to officers@mistletoeheights.org.

The City Project of replacing water lines with the addition of some new curbs and sidewalks on the West side of Forest Park Boulevard continue. If you have issues, you may contact Lozano Paving at 214-227-5132 or doors@lozanopaving.com. Or if you want Councilman Beck to see the report, use MyFW app. Her office reviews all District 9 reports on the app.

There are approximately 75 books left to be sold. We want to sell all before the end of the year. The website for book sales is back up and running. The Sales Tax Issue was brought up. Graham and Brian have been talking to the Berkley Treasurer who has recommended their CPA. The CPA recommended completing the paperwork to become an official 501©4 charity. Before the tax is paid, the organization must go through all the official channels to get a State Sales Tax account. The Berkley CPA has recommended a lawyer. State Sales Tax must be paid by Dec. 20th. MHA has not yet hired either a CPA or lawyer. It was pointed out by a resident that Tax Day is less than a month away. It was suggested we pay tax for all the books, whether they have been sold this year or not.

The Christmas Party at the Triangle will be on the afternoon of December 6th at 3:30PM. MHA will purchase insurance for the upcoming neighborhood events.

The Annual Potluck Dinner will be hosted by the Mitchells at 1320 Mistletoe Dr. on Sunday, December 7th, from 6:30pm until 8:30pm. The current email service was set up quite a few years ago by Scott Ewing, when Scott had more "leisure time". Scott is busier now and does not have much time to address issues when they arise. Currently, we have three moderators who read the emails and then releases the emails if they are deemed to meet MHA email guidelines. Very few emails are rejected. Lately, all three moderators have been seeing issues of delayed emails, in some cases by hours and days. If there were problems such as a missing dog, or more critically, a missing child, the delayed emails would be a problem. Some of the issues have been eliminated, but not all. The moderators could not determine exactly what was causing the issue or if the issues are fixable by the MHA administrator. Richard Yantis checked with Berkley and receives their neighborhood emails. Berkley does not moderate their emails and their email system is more active. They are required to follow guidelines and may be removed from email privileges if guidelines are followed. The biggest complaint is the "reply to all" emails when the reply is directed to one person. The question was asked: Do MHA residents want to have a monitored email system, or unmonitored. After much discussion, it seems the consensus was to keep it monitored to eliminate too many emails. If you would like to be a monitor, please let the officers know: officers@mistletoeheights.org. A meeting with Scott Ewing will be set up to address email issues. The latest guidelines have not been posted, waiting on the admin to do so.

The city has asked MHA to revive the MH Historical Preservation Committee to be the initial contact for residents that are considering renovations, additions, demolitions and new constructions. The committee would exist to review building plans and give input from the neighborhood's perspective. The committee would not have any



enforcement power, but the city is willing to listen to neighborhood input. A motion was made by Rosaline Takes and seconded by Elisa Rode to have Josh Lindsey to chair the committee and recruit three members who are homeowners that live in overlay. In the discussion it was decided not to limit membership to homeowners that live in overlay. Motion was made by Patrick Sheridan to amend the motion to membership who owns land or resides in Mistletoe Heights. The motion was seconded by Donna Dempsey and the motion passed. Please email Kathy Jo Rogers or officers if you know of anyone that has recently moved to the neighborhood so she may greet them with a Welcome Basket. A reminder that The Hilton Garden Inn and Cambria Hotels offer a discount for families/guests of Mistletoe Heights.

Brian Hunt presented Jeri Jo Blackmon a plaque recognizing her service as treasurer for MHA for 17+ years. A plaque was also presented to Rosaline Eastepp Takes recognizing the past year and previous years of service for MHA.


