Deliver the message as one neighbor to another...and maybe with a slice of pie or a cup of coffee.

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Email system

At the Mistletoe Heights Association's last meeting, there was a discussion about the possibility of switching to a new email system. The idea is to switch to a system which will allow more than one mass email to be distributed per hour (which is the limitation of our current system). This would allow for comments and discussions to be held directly through your email rather than requiring you to log on to the website to post your comments on the topic at hand. Many at the last meeting said they don't want to go to the website for discussions. Those that indicated they had tried to do so, said they had difficulty posting to the website.

With that said, we are asking those of you who use the email list to help us as we work through this possibility. Our webmaster, Scott Ewing says he can set up the new email list for us. However, we must find enough people who are willing to volunteer to monitor the new list. Laurie McCoy has been the current email list monitor for two years and is ready to pass this job along to new neighbors. Give her a round of applause for doing this by herself for two years!

We expect to need maybe four people who are willing to do the monitoring. The monitors could work out a schedule (if necessary) to limit the time they need to be available for monitoring. If we monitor from 8 a.m. to midnight each day that is 16 hours ~ divided by 4 volunteers is 4 hours a day each. We would need to set up some sort of "rules" for participants to adhere to so as not to allow offensive language or unkind personal remarks. Of course, that's what the monitors are for. They wouldn't allow emails with offensive remarks to be distributed to the group.

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

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

Ants, anybody?

Do you have stressed plants with withering yellow or brown-edged leaves? Try gently scratching the earth's surface with a fork two to three inches from the main stalk and the culprits will surface. The ants will nervously begin to move.

Keep a water pitcher nearby with a mixture of 1 gallon of water, 1 c. of molasses from the garden supply store, 2 tablespoons of citrus oil and 2 tablespoons of Garrett juice to soak the earth's surface within a 12- inch diameter of the plant's main stalk. The molasses creates a good habitat for good microorganisms to munch on the ants' skeletons. The citrus oil will kill the ants on contact. The Garrett juice will give the plant a gentle nudge of recuperation from the disturbance of ants on its roots. If there is a large mound of fire ants, pour four quarts of hot boiling water on it and there you have it ~ a large mound of soft-boiled ants. Keep the above methods off the plant.





Yard of the month: 2211 Weatherbee

The sidewalk that leads to the front porch is flanked with lilies and monkey grass. Large containers of caladiums with variegated English Ivy and colorful crotons edge the steps.

The front windows are accented with window boxes planted with pink caladiums, variegated liriope and variegated English Ivy. A large Japanese Yew separates the arched windows with a layer of nandinas in front. The final front gradation is a profusion of pink angel wing begonia.

Both ends of the house are anchored with vibrant pink crepe myrtle. A red oak gives an asymmetrical balance to the front lawn. Congratulations to the Hardts. They will receive a gift certificate from Calloways Nursery as an extra award.

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

The quarterly meeting was called to order by Jeff Davis, President of MHA at 7:15

<u>Neighborhood Officer</u>: Officer Russell shared some great tips on protecting our neighborhood. He suggested when a resident sees suspicious behavior to take note of as many identifying details as possible. Besides vehicle make and model and color, also look for bumper stickers, cracked windshields, tinted windows, dents or scratches. While a license plate number is important, it is not always easy to remember and anything a person can recall is helpful to the police. Please call him anytime you see something you feel is suspicious or needs to be checked out. 817-991-8472

Neighborhood Repairs: Jeff Davis announced that the sprinkler system on the West Rosedale berm has been repaired at a cost of \$546.00. Patsy Slocum voiced a desire to improve the entrance to MH, suggesting landscaping, and the input and design of a Landscape Architect. A unanimous vote was reached to create a MH Entrance Committee with Michael Danella as Chairman. Lisa Gowan and Patsy Slocum volunteered to reside on the committee. Their first step will be to look for local Landscape Architects who might be interested in offering their time and services to develop possible designs and proposals for a new entrance. This is a fantastic opportunity to be involved in, as the creation of an entrance to MH will stand for many years to come welcoming people to our great neighborhood. <u>Midtown</u>: There will be a meeting to discuss the Midtown Project. When a date is set it will be sent through the MH e-mail system, posted on the website and be included in the newsletter.

<u>Gas/Oil Leases</u>: For any neighborhood resident who previously signed a gas and oil lease with Chesapeake, they will now have the opportunity to sign a new lease with XTO as the Chesapeake leases are set to expire.
